2023 Highlights:

Strong relationships drive effective communications

In 2023, we:

- Continued to cultivate strong relationships with regulators;
- ▶ Boosted CBAA's political profile through concentrated engagement and advocacy efforts, including:
- Presenting a proposal for a study examining the propriety of the luxury tax implementation process;
- Promoting key issues during budget consultations;
- Meeting with senior government stakeholders and elected officials;
- Issuing briefing packages to new ministers, staff and officials in 2023; and,
- Gathering useful intelligence through key committee meetings.
- Released CBAA's <u>2023 Aviation Compensation Study</u>, pointing to higher salaries in corporate aviation compared to comparable job families;
- Issued CBAA's 2022 Economic Impact Study, which determined that business aviation operations and business aircraft manufacturing generate \$9.2 billion in GDP and more than 50,000 high-paying Canadian jobs (see table below); and,
- Completed our 2024 Pre-Budget Submission, which called for a moratorium on the luxury tax, encouraged sustainable aviation investments, and highlighted the need for better infrastructure at regional airports.

The Year in Review

Our Mission: To be the voice for Business Aviation in Canada

This year, CBAA marked five years of steady achievement and growth under the leadership of President and CEO, Anthony Norejko. In August, Anthony wrote a <u>letter</u> to CBAA members thanking them for their dedication, passion and unwavering support for the association and its work.

"Together, we've weathered challenges, celebrated victories, and have set the stage for an even brighter future," wrote Anthony.

Over the past five years, CBAA has seen significant membership growth, launched tireless advocacy campaigns, and continued to champion business aviation safety. As the industry's collective voice has grown stronger, CBAA has seen increased recognition of its role as the voice of Canadian business aviation.

Moving forward, the CBAA team is committed to maintaining this incredible momentum as we work with members to shape the future of business aviation in Canada.

In 2023, we lobbied government to:

- Commence a study, spearheaded by the Standing Joint Committee for the Scrutiny of Regulations, to examine the legalities associated with the luxury tax implementation;
- Consider business aviation priorities when preparing Budget 2023 and Budget 2024;
- Improve access and reduce wait times for business aviation aircraft at Canadian airports;
- Adjust flight and duty time regulations to reflect challenges posed by Covid-19 and the difficulties finding and training crew to meet new regulations for 703 and 704 operations;

- ▶ Take concrete steps to encourage a domestic supply of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) in order to meet the industry goal of becoming net-zero by 2050; and,
- Raise CBAA's profile through coordinated meetings and briefing packages directed to senior government stakeholders and elected officials.

We increased member value by:

- Releasing our fourth annual <u>CBAA Aviation</u>. <u>Compensation Study</u> (see table below), confirming once again that the business aviation sector pays, on average, 11 per cent more than airlines/charter firms and 19 per cent higher than maintenance/manufacturing firms across comparable job families;
- Concluding our latest <u>Economic Impact Study</u> with InterVISTAS Consulting, pointing to the significant and measurable financial contributions made by business aviation operations and manufacturing facilities;
- Maintaining our members-only Slack channel, a forum to share best practices, identify challenges and evaluate government decisions;
- Welcoming the business aviation community to inperson events and chapter meetings;
- Intervening with Transport Canada to promote clear communication about the regulator's recent revisions to aircraft deregistration documentation – CBAA has suggested that TC issue a formal notification for all future changes to forms or certificates.
- Helping to fast-track regulatory approvals and simplifying compliance with minimum equipment lists, type ratings and looking at additional delegations;
- Releasing CBAA's new year-round <u>online member</u> <u>directory</u> to connect sellers and buyers.
